## CADET RESPONSIBILITIES

Higher-ranking cadets have additional responsibilities:

## PARADE NIGHTS

831 Black Knights parade at:

**Location:** Canadian North Hanger 2

**Day/Time:** Tuesday evenings from 18:30 to 21:00.

**Training Attire:** FTU (green uniforms)



We start at 6:30 p.m. sharp with a uniform inspection and parade. Cadets then break into smaller groups, according to their levels and receive instruction.

## COMMANDING OFFICER (CO'S) PARADE

CO's Parade takes place on the **1st Tuesday of every month.**

**Location:** Canadian North Hanger 2

**Day/Time:** Tuesday evenings from 18:30 to 21:00.

**Important Note:** *Parents should arrive at 21:00 to hear CO's announcements.*

**CO's parade attire:** C2 (Blue Dress Uniforms)

CO's parade is a military-style inspection event where the Commanding Officer (CO) inspects the squadron, acknowledging cadet achievements, and presenting promotions and awards. CO's parades coincide with our Squadron Sponsoring Committee (SSC) Meetings. Parents are encouraged to attend both the SSC meeting and the final portion of the CO'S Parade to watch awards and receive important updates from our Commanding Officer.

## UNIFORMS

Uniforms are provided free of charge by the Department of National Defense for the entire time your cadet is enrolled. It is YOUR CADET's responsibility to care for and maintain their uniform. Parents can support this by encouraging them to iron their uniform, polish their boots, and teach them how to sew on their own badges—it's all part of the cadet experience! There are two standard uniforms, but multiple ways to wear them. Please refer to the [Cadets and Junior Rangers Group \(CJCR\) Dress Instructions](#) for specifics.

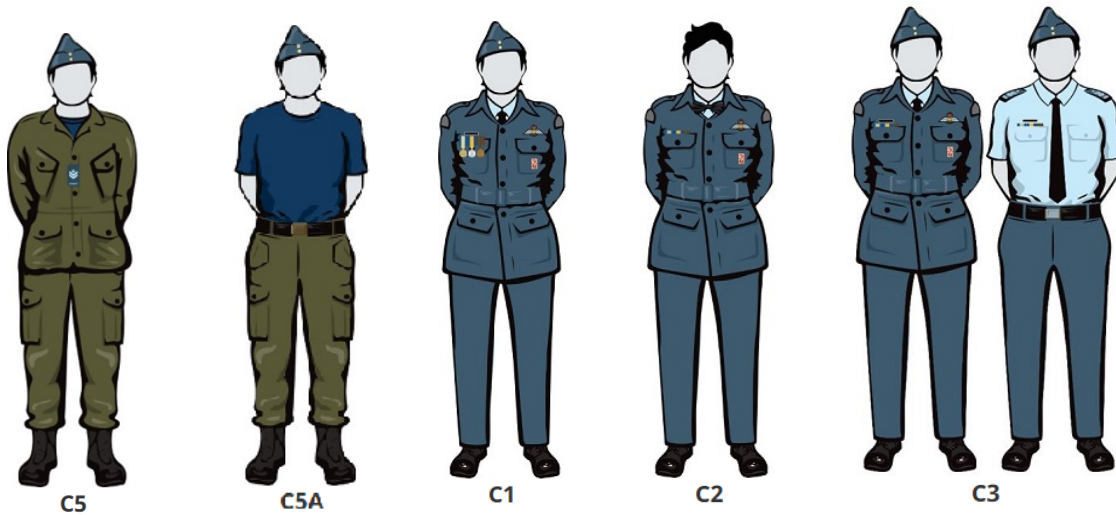


## FTU - Field Training Uniform - Green

This is worn on regular parade nights and occasional activities outside of the regular Tuesday nights.

## Dress Uniform - Blue

This is typically worn on CO's Parade Nights (1st Tuesday of each month) and occasionally when taking tours/representing the squadron outside of regular activities.



**C5** - Typical Tuesday Parade and FTX

**C5A** - Same as C5, just without jacket

**C1** - CO's Parade, Formal Dress w/ medals. Dress for inspection by CO..

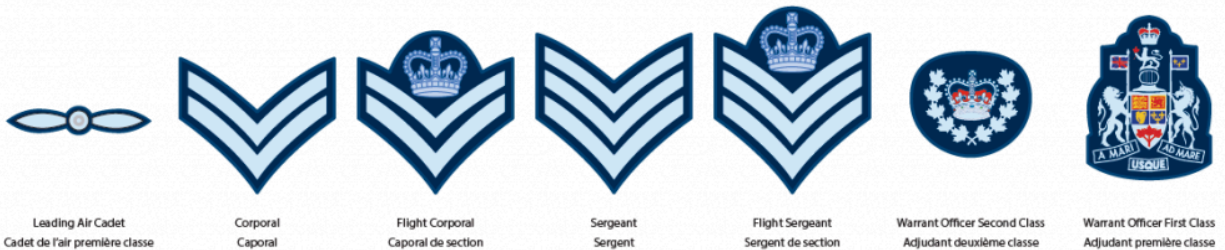
**C2** - Formal event - eg: Mess Dinner, bowtie, no medals, no wedge/hat

**C3** - Out in public representing Cadets - Blue dress for respect

If your cadet outgrows a uniform item, it can be exchanged (please wash it first) by speaking with the Supply Officers on Tuesday evenings or submitting a Uniform Request Form on our 831 Black Knights website.

## **AC Air Cadet**

The rank of Air Cadet is granted upon enrollment – must be 12 years of age, but not 19 years of age to enroll

## **LAC Leading Air Cadet**

For promotion to Leading Air Cadet, a cadet must:

- Actively participate in the proficiency level 1 of the LHQ training program for a minimum period of six months
- Be recommended by the appropriate flight commander (officer)

## **CPL Corporal**

For promotion to Corporal, a cadet must:

- Hold the rank of Leading Air Cadet
- Have successfully completed the first year of the proficiency level training (Proficiency Level 1)
- Be recommended by the appropriate flight commander (officer)

## **FCPL Flight Corporal**

For promotion to Flight Corporal, a cadet must:

- Complete at least six months service at the rank of Corporal
- Have successfully completed the second year of the proficiency level training program (Proficiency Level 2)
- Be recommended by the appropriate flight commander (officer)

## **SGT Sergeant**

For promotion to Sergeant, a cadet must:

- Complete at least six months service at the rank of Flight Corporal
- Have successfully completed the third year of the proficiency level training program (Proficiency Level 3)
- Be recommended by the appropriate flight commander (officer)

## **FSGT Flight Sergeant**

For promotion to Flight Sergeant, a cadet must:

- Complete at least six months service at the rank of Sergeant
- Have successfully completed the fourth year of the proficiency level training program (Proficiency Level 4)
- Be recommended by the appropriate flight commander (officer)



## **WOII Warrant Officer 2nd Class**

For promotion to Warrant Officer Second Class, a cadet must:

- Completed at least six months service at the substantive rank of Flight Sergeant
- Be identified as a successful candidate through the merit review board process

## **WOI Warrant Officer 1st Class (Chief)**

For promotion to Warrant Officer First Class, a cadet must:

- Completed at least six months service at the substantive rank of Warrant Officer 2nd Class
- Be identified as a successful candidate through the merit review board process

**\*\*Squadrons are limited to one Warrant Officer First Class. The Warrant Officer First Class position must be vacant for a cadet to be promoted. An existing Warrant Officer First Class may keep their rank if they transfer to another squadron.**

There are 5 Air cadet levels (I, II, III, IV, V). These levels refer to the Canadian Cadet Movement's rank structure, which progresses from Air Cadet to Warrant Officer First Class (WO1), promotions based on merit, meeting national training standards, and the Commanding Officer's approval. Each rank represents increasing responsibility, leadership skills, and completion of training levels, such as completing [proficiency levels](#) and leadership training and merit review board for Flight Sergeant and above.

## **SQUADRON ACTIVITIES**

Below is a list of common activities that squadrons may offer, though not all will run every year. This is simply a guide to the types of activities that could be part of your cadet's experience. Parents are encouraged to motivate their cadets to participate in optional activities, as these opportunities foster teamwork and skill development. Teams are formed based on cadet interest and participation.

**Effective Speaking** - This is a seasonal activity beginning in September and culminating with area/regional and national competitions beginning in the spring.

**FAM Flying** - Cadets go to Josephburg Airport and fly in a small plane to experience a motorized plane.

**Flag Party** - Cadets learn the proper procedure for carrying the flags during the regular parade night and special events.

**Gliding Day** - Cadets go to Villeneuve Airport and experience flying in RCACS gliders.

**Ground School** - Weekly classes are held from November to January, day and



time to be set by the instructor. This activity prepares the Cadets for the compulsory qualifying exams required for scholarship qualifications.

**Precision Drill Team** – Weekly practices are held for the competition team. They practice marching movements and learn a specially prepared drill (marching) routine to be performed at provincial competitions.

**Marksmanship** - Cadets learn proficiency with air rifles.

**Rifle Team** - A five (5) person team selected from Cadets who attend Open Range to represent 831 at provincial competitions. This may include National competitions.

# ANNUAL CEREMONIAL REVIEW (ACR)

**Annual Ceremonial Review (ACR)** is the most important event of the Air Cadet training year, where squadrons formally showcase their learned skills to families, friends, and dignitaries through a parade and award presentations. The ACR is mandatory for cadets to complete their training level, receive rank appointments, and qualify for awards. It features a formal parade with a march past, the inspection and





address by a reviewing officer, and the presentation of awards for the year's accomplishments.

All Cadets are eligible to receive an Attendance pin. Please note, pins will only be received based on their attendance. If Cadets accumulate more excused absences than listed below, they will be ineligible for this award.

Gold (2 excused absences permitted)

Silver (4 excused absences permitted)

Bronze (6 excused absences permitted)

## **MERIT REVIEW BOARDS**

Air Cadet selection boards evaluate applications for training and promotions through a combination of scores from the application and interview. Volunteers from the Canadian Cadet League (CCL) often assist in the process. The goal is to ensure fair, merit-based selection while giving cadets experience with formal reviews. Candidates are encouraged to practice before the interview. During the interview, cadets are asked about current events, squadron knowledge, the Air Cadet structure, personal interests, and the specific position or rank they are applying for.

## **SUMMER CAMPS**

Each year, hundreds of Air Cadets have the opportunity to attend summer camps throughout the country. Courses cover a wide range of subjects from basic training to music, athletics, leadership and flying. There are no costs to attend summer camps, however available spaces are limited.

Cadets are recommended by the Squadron for junior camps. Junior camps are usually two weeks in length. Most senior camps are four weeks in length. All expenses including transportation are provided for by the Department of National Defence.

## FUNDRAISING

The Air Cadet Program is **proudly supported** by three main partners:

- **The Government of Canada** through the Department of National Defence which covers the costs of uniforms and mandatory training for cadets.
- **The Alberta Air Cadet League** which purchases and maintains the gliding equipment located at the Villeneuve Airport.
- **Parents and Guardians**, through the **SSC** which provides additional funds through the fundraising efforts.

If your child is a member of 831 Black Knights Squadron, please note that you are automatically a member of the SSC. Together, we share the responsibility of helping fund the essential elements of the cadet experience that are not covered by government funding.



**Each year, the SSC (parents & guardians) raise approximately \$35,000, or about \$350/cadet. This does not include uniform costs. It does however, cover costs such as:**

- Training materials and program supplies
- Operating costs
- Transportation
- Canteen & other nutrition items requested by CO.

## **VOLUNTEER BONDS - Beginning 2025-2026 Year**

To help ensure we meet our financial goals, the SSC introduced an **optional and refundable Volunteer Fundraising Bond**, approved by SSC parents at the May 2025 AGM. This bond, launching for the **2025-2026 training year**, provides parents with the opportunity to:

- ✓ Participate in planned fundraising efforts
- ✓ Help support our cadets' programs
- ✓ Receive a full refund once your volunteer commitment is met



This initiative is a key step in securing the future success of our squadron and enriching our cadets' experience throughout the year. We sincerely appreciate your support as we continue to grow and strengthen the 831 Black Knights Squadron.

**The volunteer fundraising bond value for the 2025-2026 training year is \$250/cadet.**

**Bond Value (due by Nov 4, 2025):**

\$250 – first cadet in household

\$150 – each additional cadet

**For cadets registering in/after Jan 2026:**

\$200 – first cadet

\$100 – each additional cadet

*Disclaimer: Volunteer Fundraising Bond amounts are reviewed annually by the SSC and may be adjusted for future training years. Any changes will be communicated to families prior to the start of the new training year. Bond amounts will not change during the current training year once collected.*

Payments can be made through the following options: **cash or cheques** - post dated to May 31, 2026. (Please note: that NSF cheques will incur an additional \$40 fee).

Parents can **earn the bond back by participating in fundraising activities**. Parents receive credits for Joining the SSC Board, helping with bottle drives, and participating in other fundraising events like selling cash calendars. If the volunteer fundraising bond credit threshold is **not met** before the end of the training year, **the bond will not be returned**.

## VOLUNTEER BONDS - FAQ

### **Can I Choose to Donate the Bond Instead of Fundraising?**

Absolutely – and we greatly appreciate it! Donating the bond is one of the most helpful contributions a parent can make. It allows the funds to be available right away for the Squadron's needs, rather than being held until the end of the year. You can still choose whether or not you'd like to participate in fundraising activities after donating.

### **What If I Prefer Not To Fundraise?**

No problem. On the Volunteer Fundraising Bond form, simply indicate that you would like to **donate the bond** and **opt out of fundraising**. Families who choose not to fundraise will not be contacted with individual fundraising tasks, though you may still receive general fundraising updates through our regular communications.

### **How and When is the Bond Returned?**

If you choose to fundraise, your bond will be refunded/returned to you at the last SSC meeting in May. Refunds are returned by cheque. We will require a signature from the parent/guardian & SSC to confirm this was returned to you.

- If your cheque expires, we will reach out to you via phone or registered mail to work out a way to return your bond. A \$10 fee will be taken off to cover the cost of registered mail. If we don't hear back within 30 days, the bond will be forfeited.





### **What Happens if My Cadet Leaves the Program During the Year?**

If your Cadet officially resigns **before January 1**, and returns all issued materials and uniforms, your bonds will be refunded as indicated below.

- Withdrawal before January: \$100 of the bond is non-refundable
- Withdrawal after January: \$200 of the bond is non-refundable

### **Are Financial Accommodations Available?**

Yes – we are committed to making the Cadet program accessible to all families. If you're facing financial challenges, simply check the "special circumstances" box on the Volunteer Fundraising Bond form. Our SSC Chair will reach out to schedule a private and respectful conversation to discuss options.

### **Isn't the Cadet Program Supposed to be Free?**

The Air Cadet Program is one of the top youth leadership and aviation programs in Canada. While there is no registration fee to join, the program is funded at the local level through **parent-led fundraising efforts**.

In the past, traditional fundraising covered the Squadron's needs. However, since COVID-19, fundraising levels have not kept pace with operational costs. The Volunteer Fundraising Bond ensures we can continue offering high-quality experiences to all Cadets – today and in the future.

### **I'm ready to do my part. What's next?**

That's great to hear! If you didn't complete the Volunteer Fundraising Bond form during September's recruitment nights, you can still do so now. Here's how:

1. Confirm your cadet is registered with 831 Black Knights Squadron.

## PARENT-GUARDIAN RESPONSIBILITIES

### **An important note about drop-offs and pick-ups:**

Please walk your cadet into the terminal for both drop-off and pick-up. This ensures they're on time, prepared, and safe. Plus, it helps you stay connected with the SSC!

We kindly ask that cadets be dropped off and picked up on time for all parade nights and events. Parade nights run from **18:30 to 21:00 (6:30pm - 9:00pm)**. If timing is tight, carpooling with other cadet families can make things easier—and more fun for the cadets too! It's a win-win: you save on fuel, cut down on travel time, and build lasting friendships along the way.

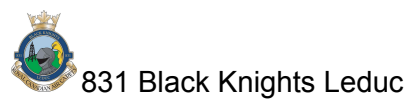
